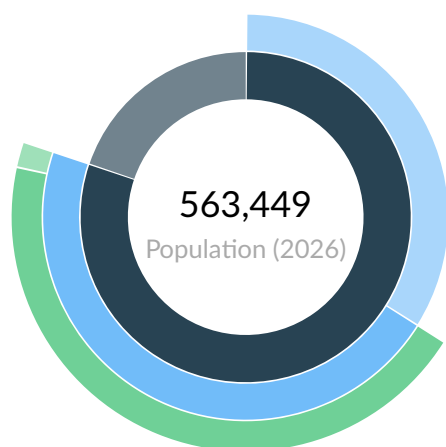
Median household income is **\$2.2K below** the national median household income of \$80.7K.

- From 2020 to 2025, jobs **increased by 10.3%** in Spokane County, WA from 254,964 to **281,259**. This change **fell short of the national growth rate of 10.7% by 0.4%**. As the number of jobs increased, the **labor force participation rate decreased from 63.6% to 60.0% between 2020 and 2025**.
- Concerning educational attainment, **21.2% of Spokane County, WA residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (0.7% below the national average), and **12.7% hold an Associate's Degree** (3.8% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2025 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, Education and Hospitals (Local Government), and General Medical and Surgical Hospitals.

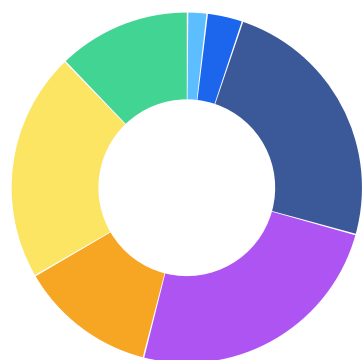

Educational Attainment

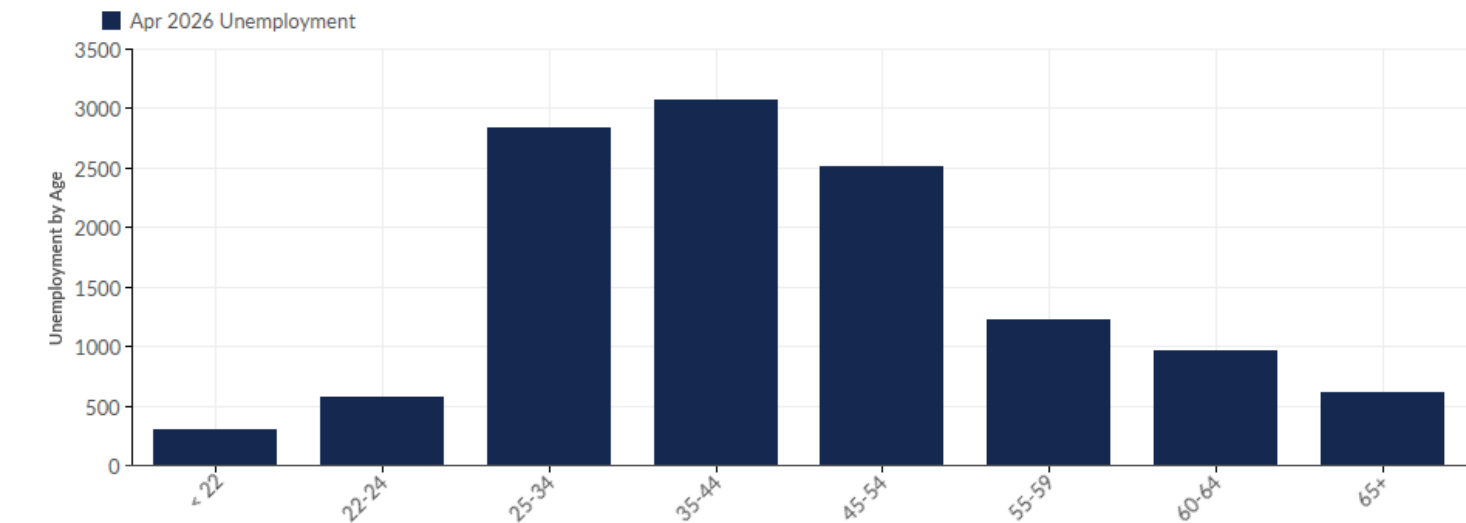

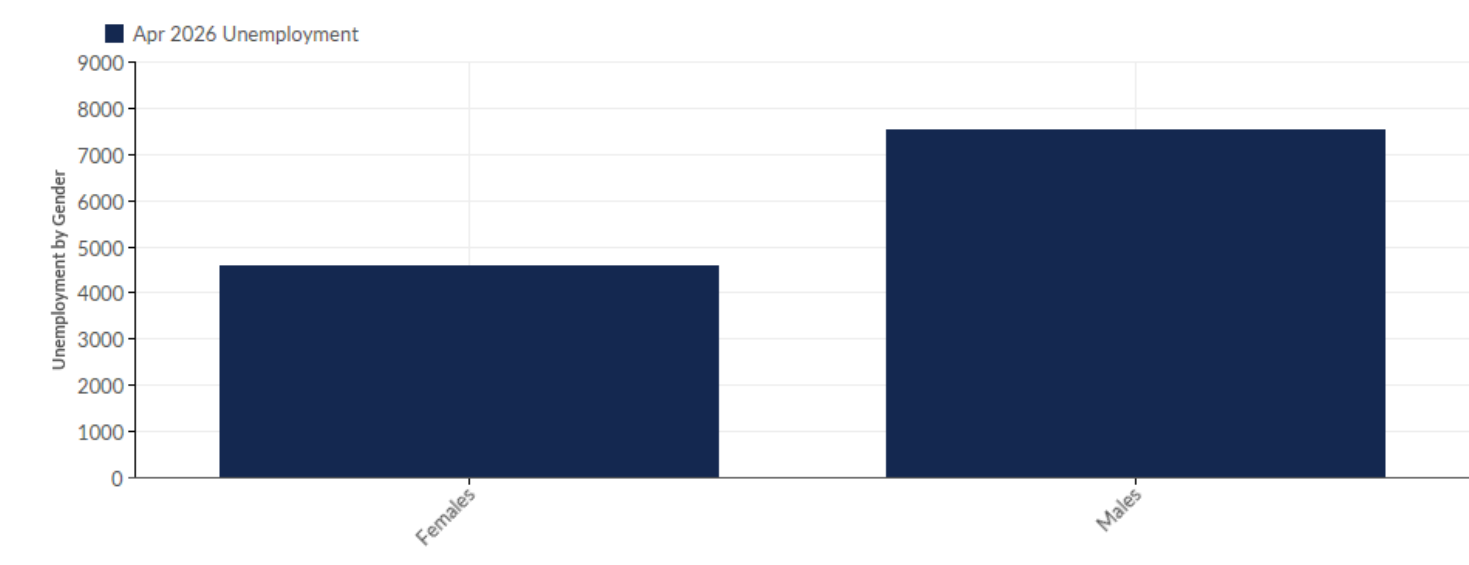

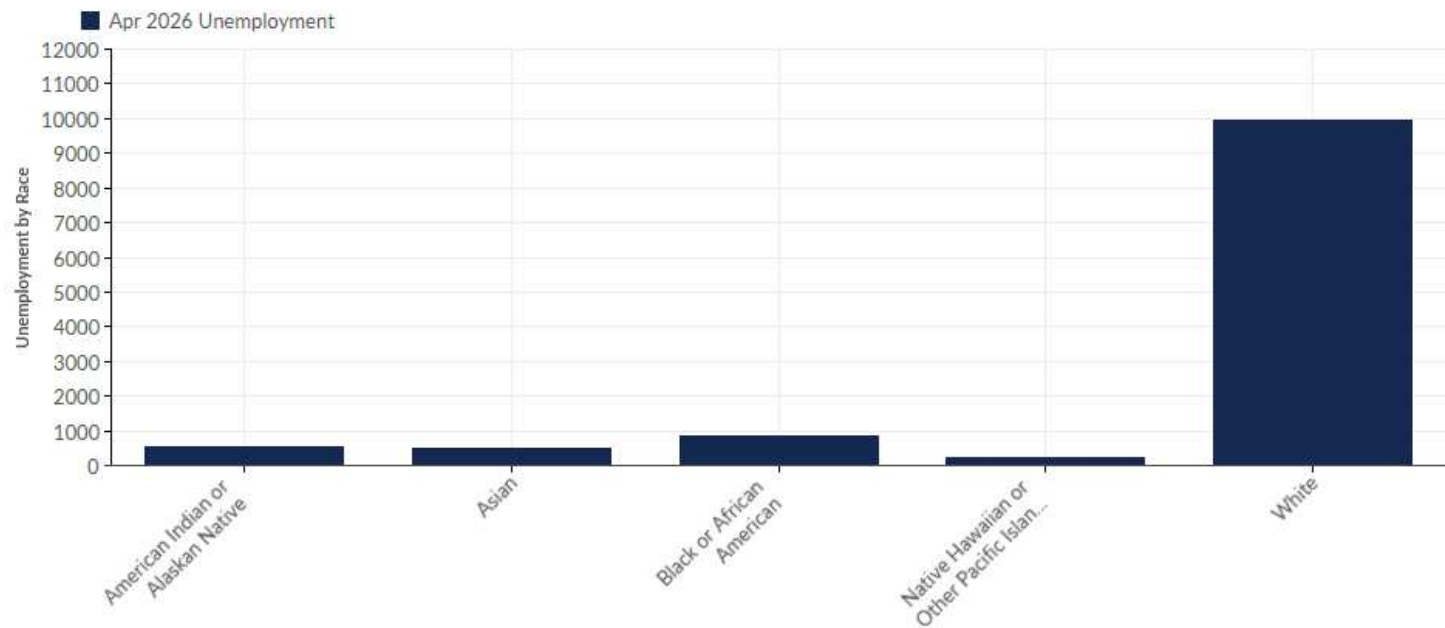

Unemployment by Gender



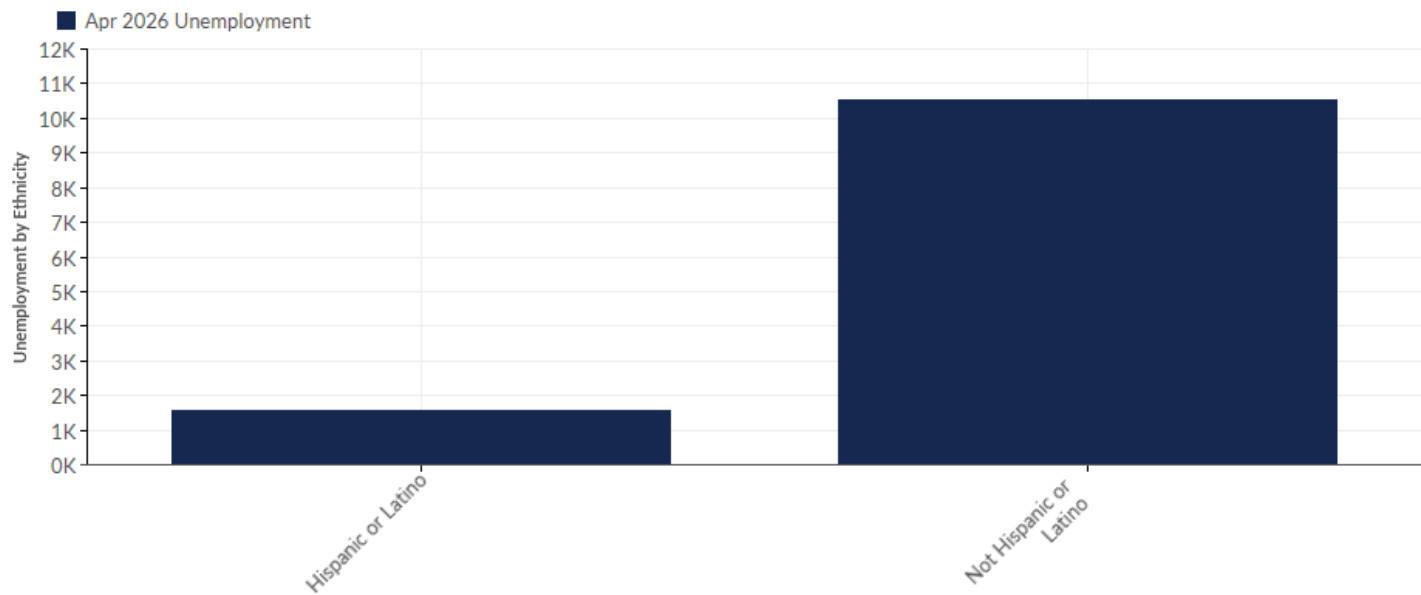

Unemployment by Ethnicity

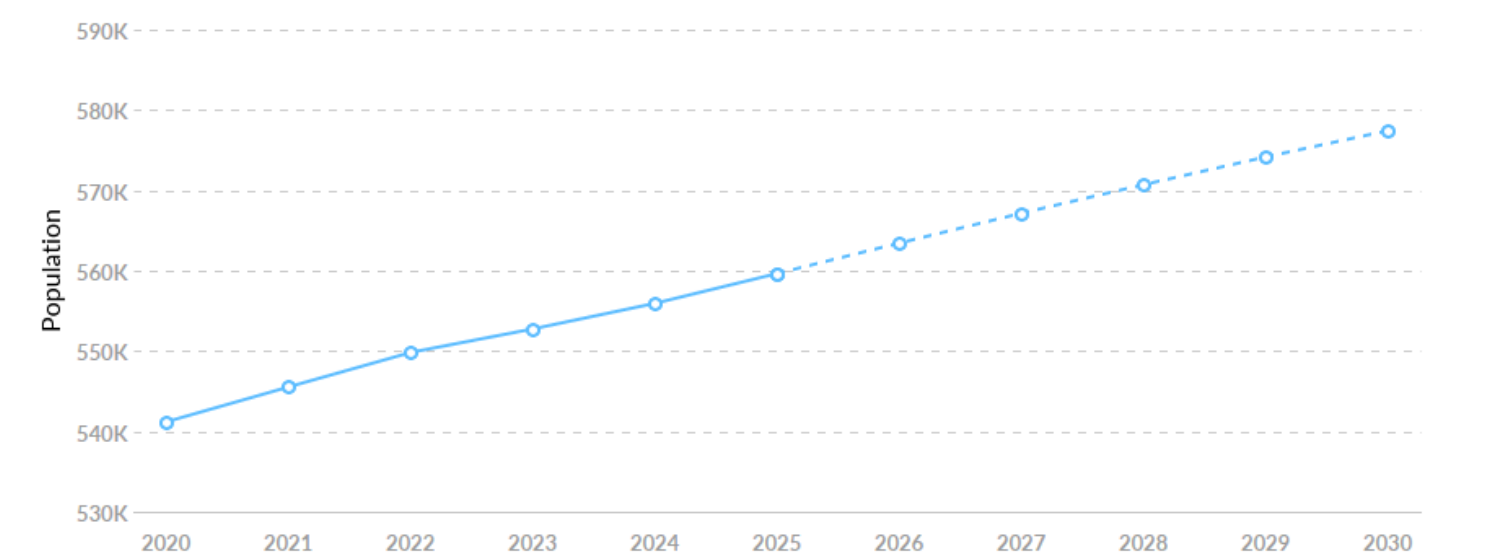

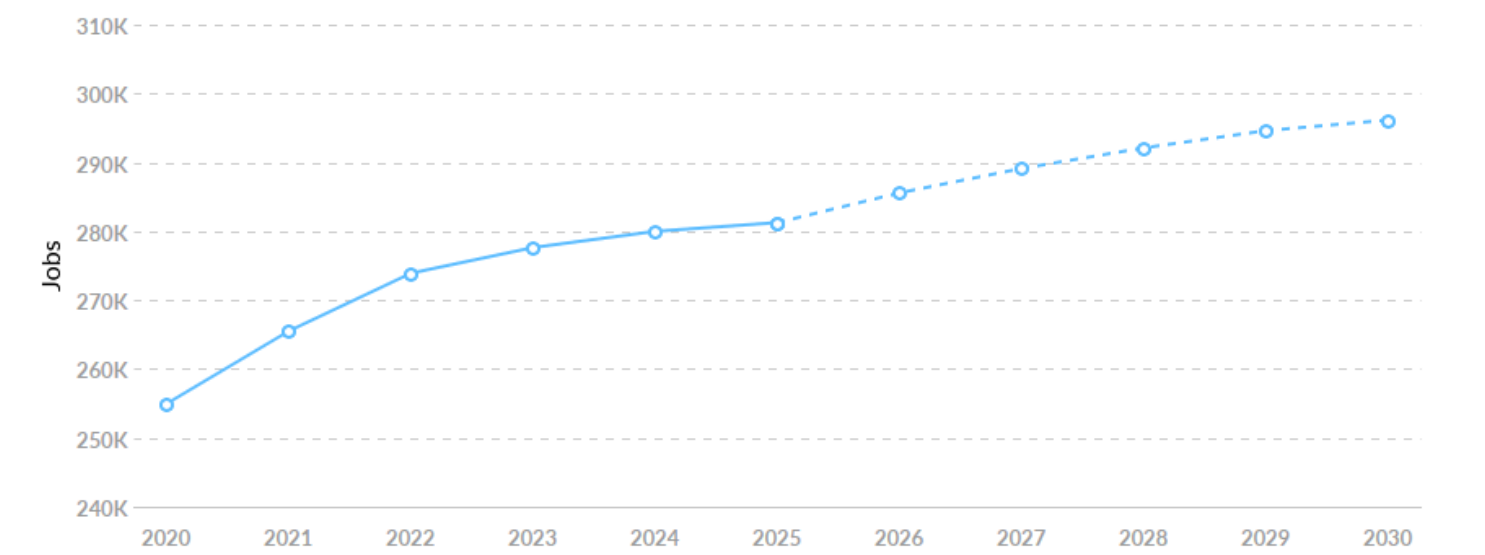

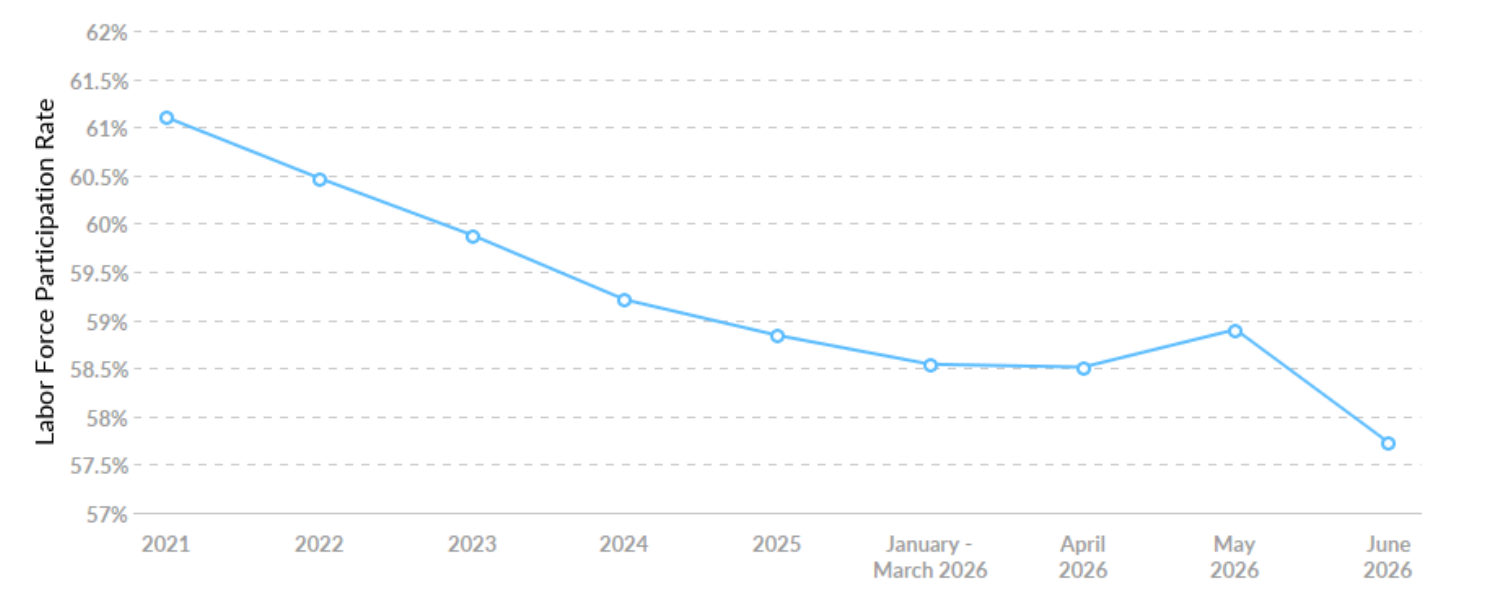
Job Trends

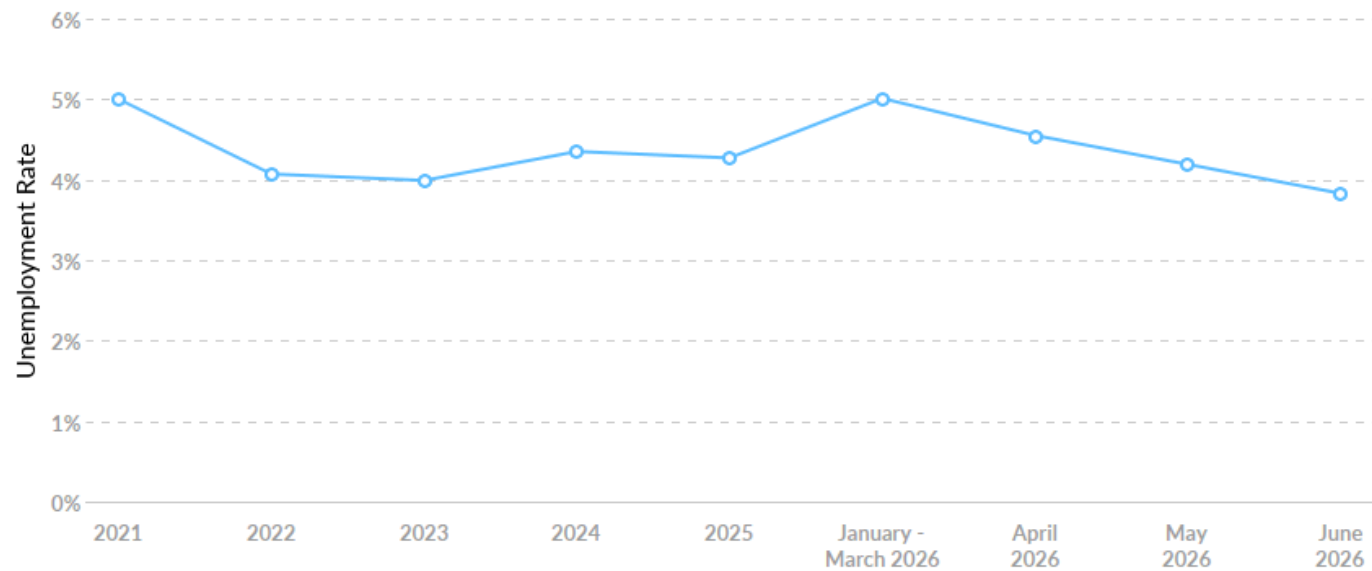

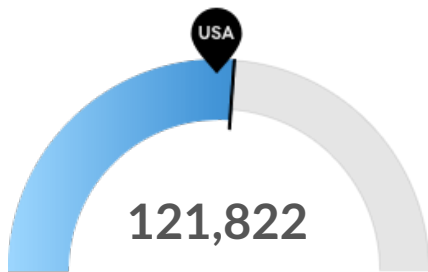
Unemployment Rate Trends

Spokane County, WA had a June 2026 unemployment rate of 3.83%, **decreasing from 5.00%** 5 years before.



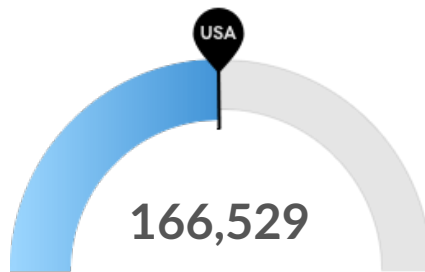

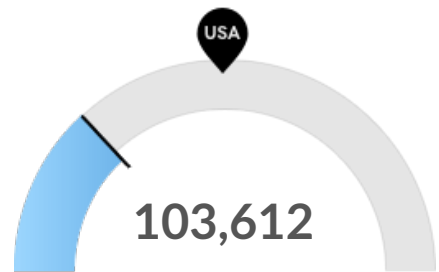
Millennials

Spokane County, WA has 121,822 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 113,808.



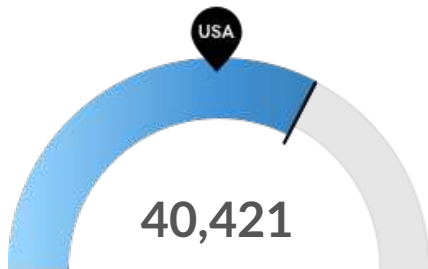
Retiring Soon

Retirement risk is about average in Spokane County, WA. The national average for an area this size is 168,105 people 55 or older, while there are 166,529 here.



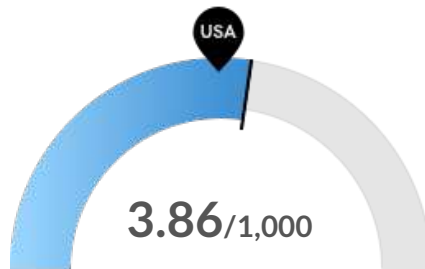
Racial Diversity

Racial diversity is low in Spokane County, WA. The national average for an area this size is 236,491 racially diverse people, while there are 103,612 here.



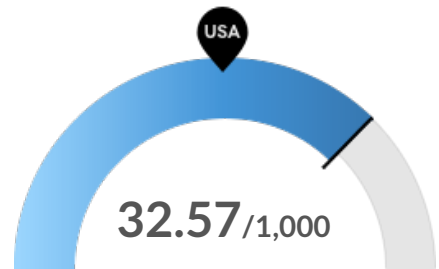
Veterans

Spokane County, WA has 3.86 violent crimes per 1,000 people. The national rate is 3.38 per 1,000 people.

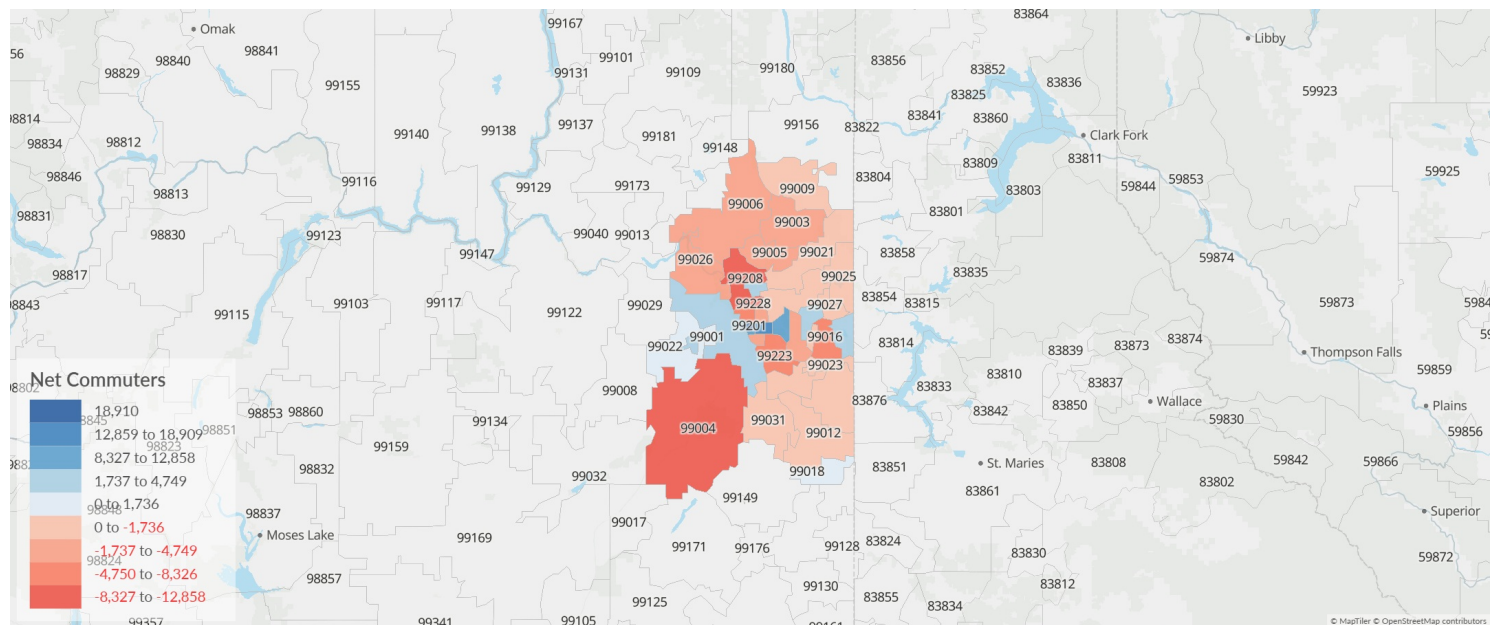


Property Crime

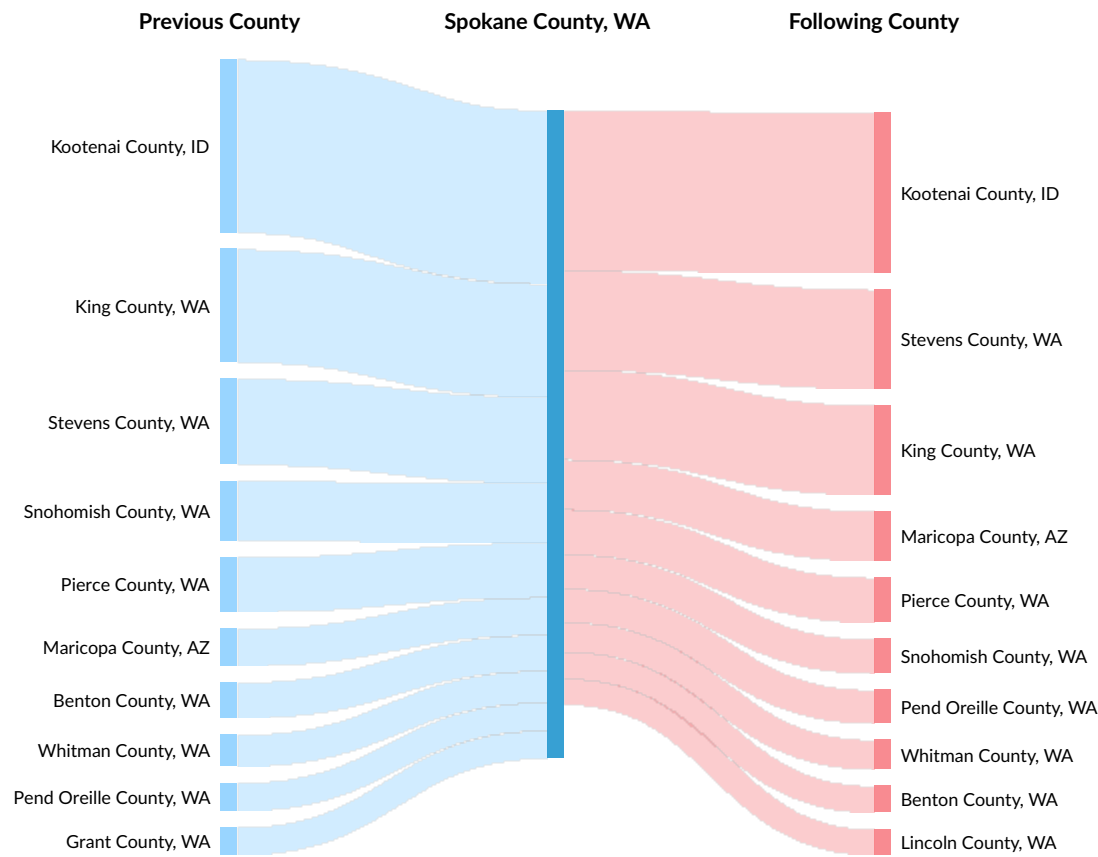

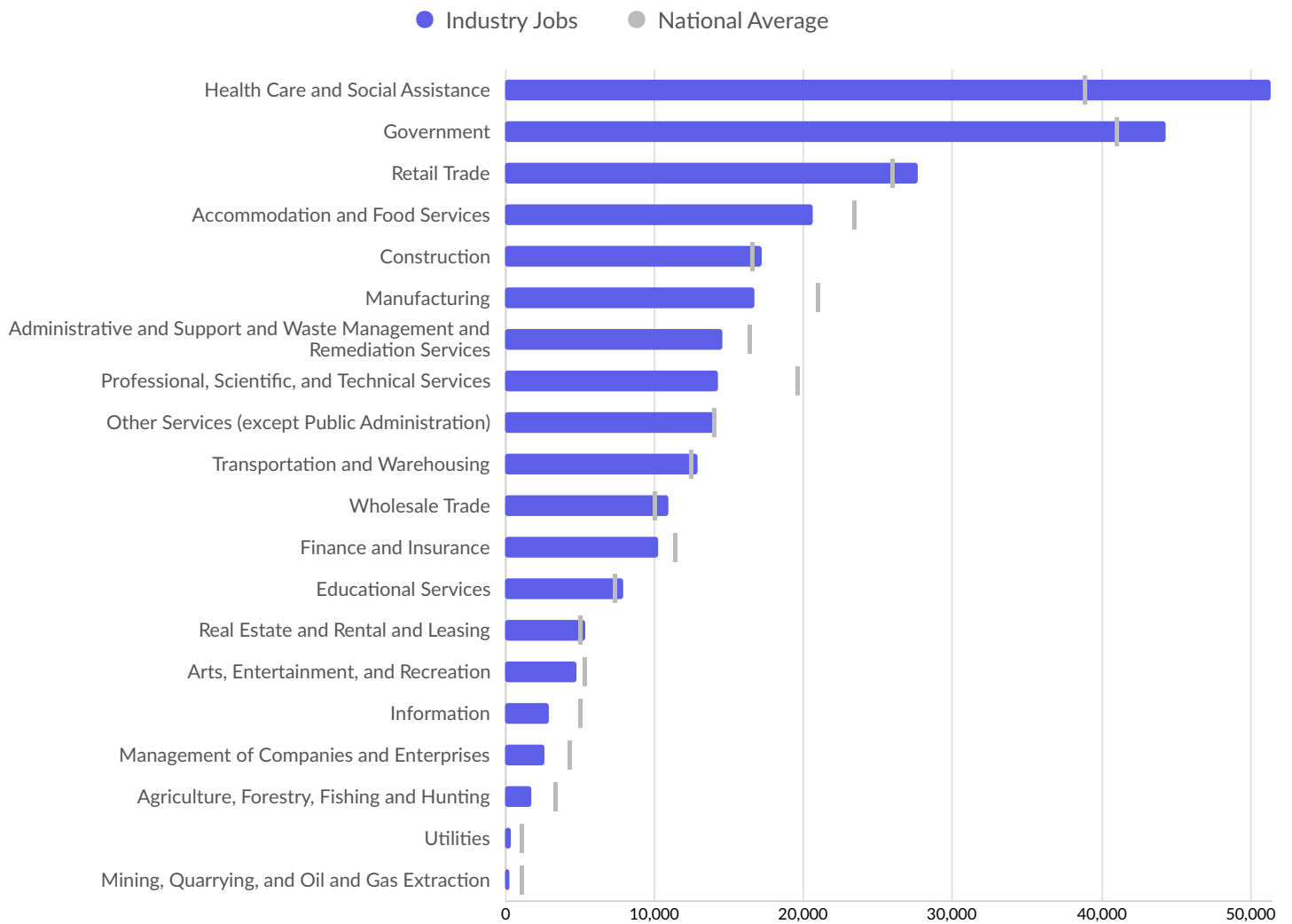

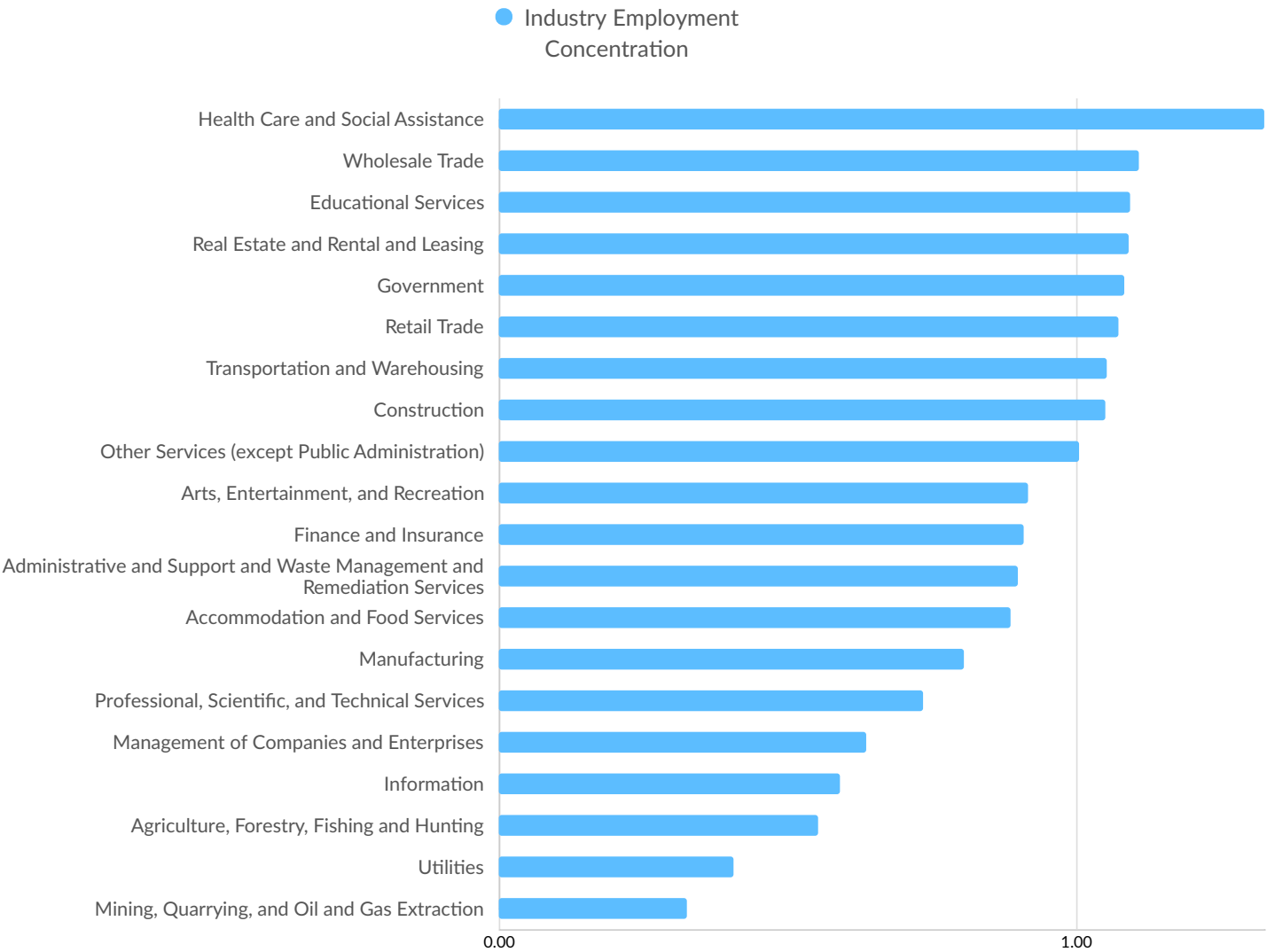

Top Growing Industries

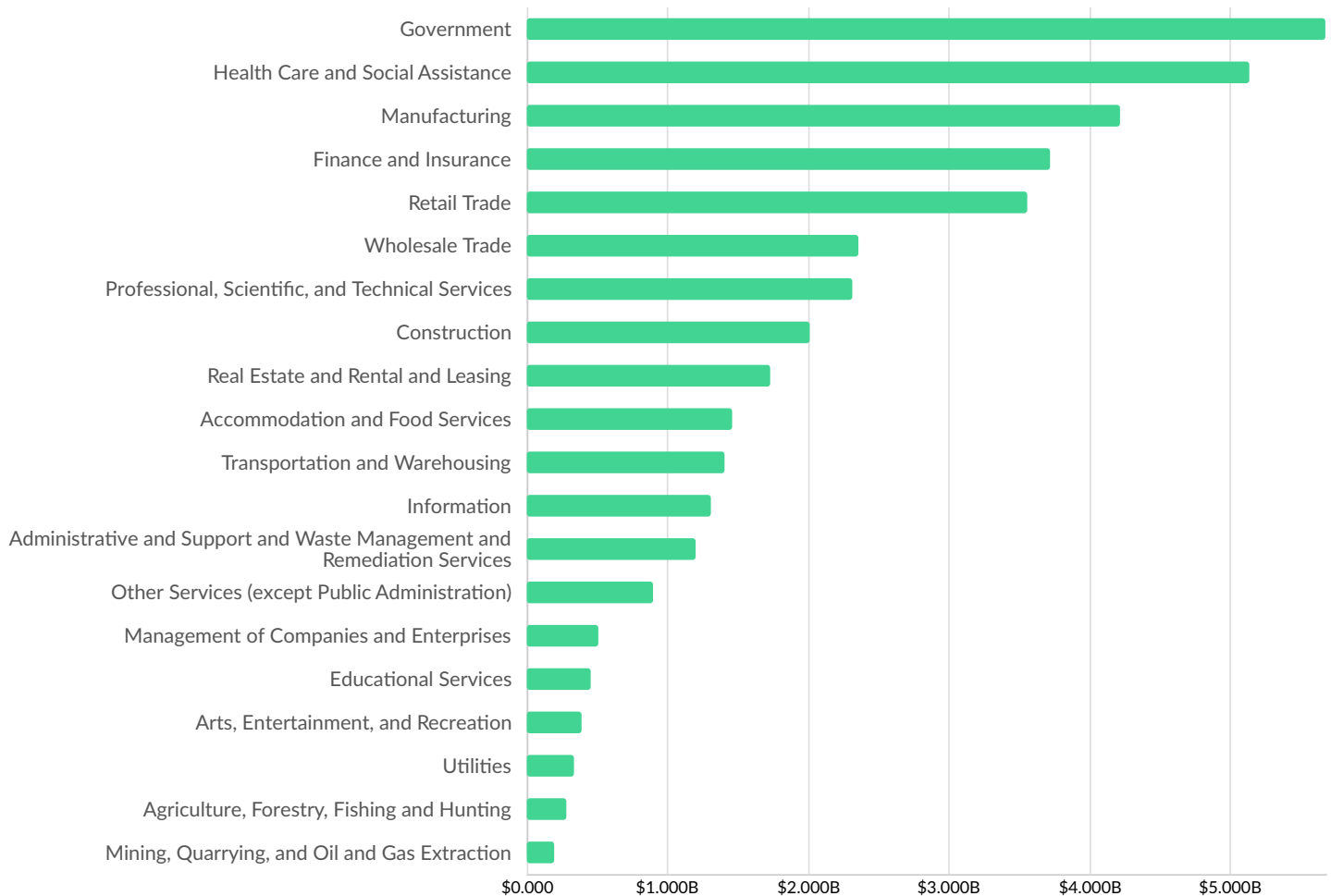


Top Industry Employment Concentration

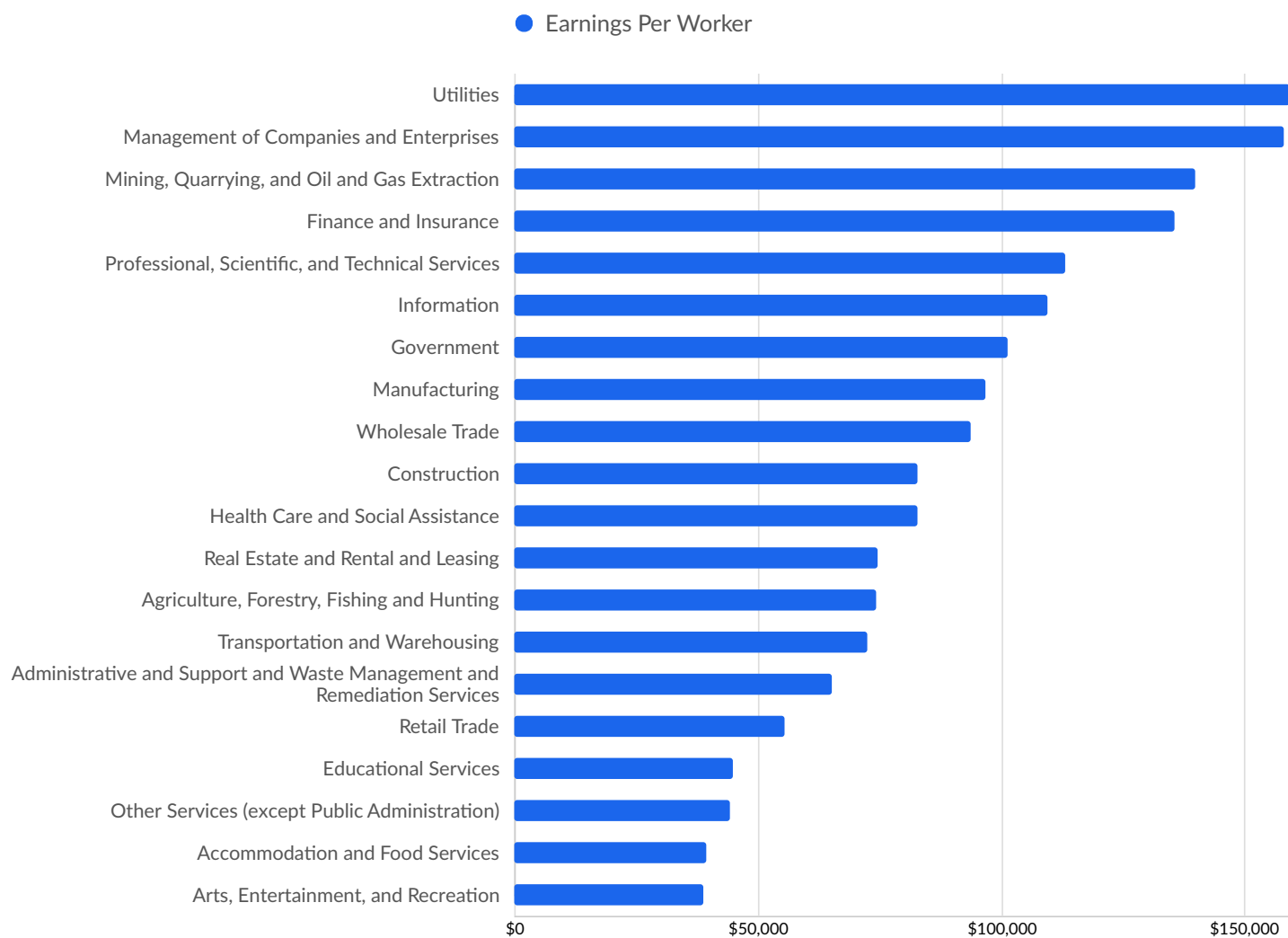


Top Industry GRP

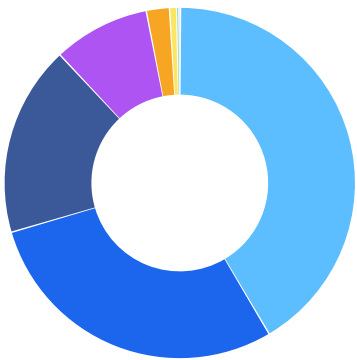

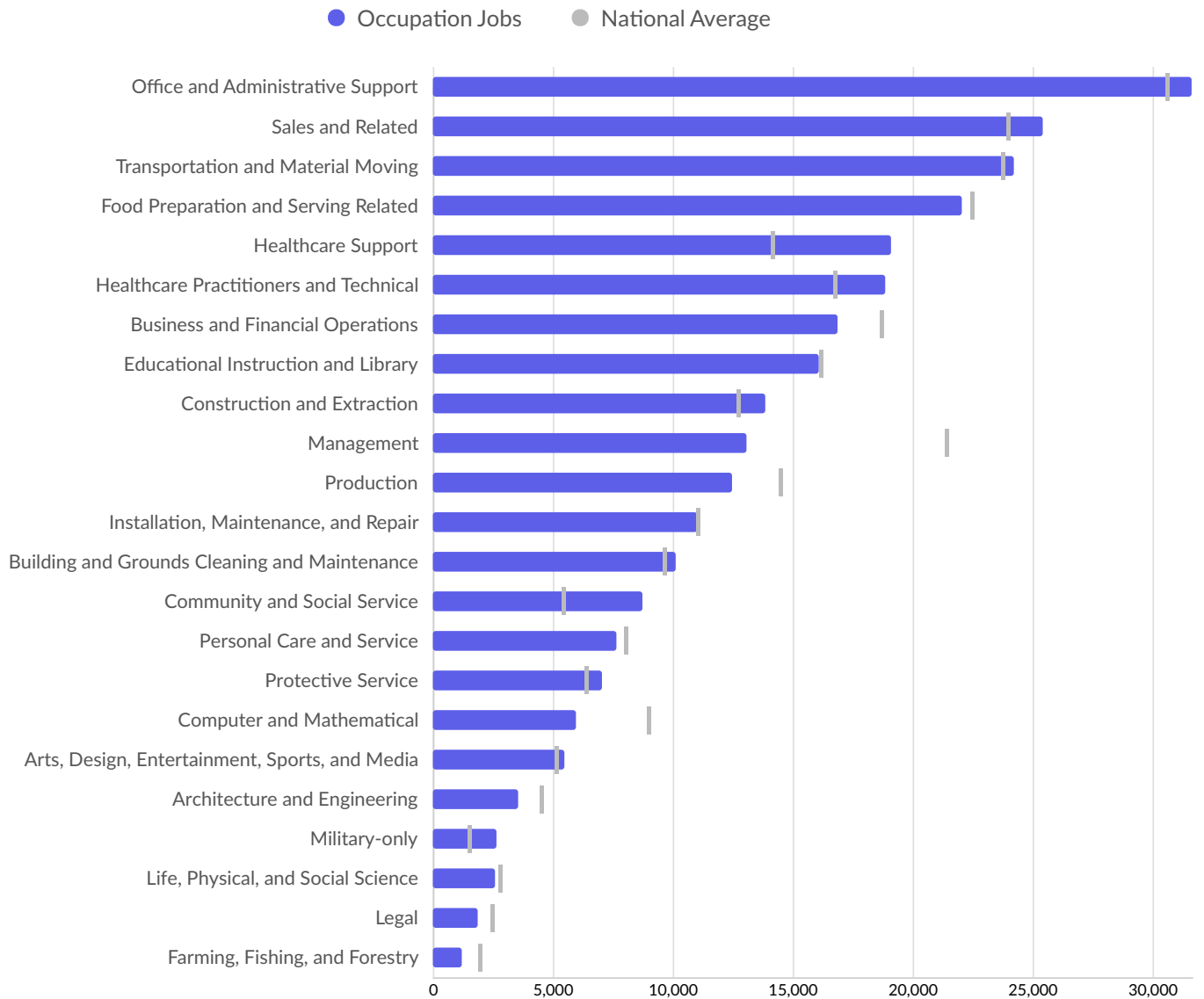
Layoff Activity (Reported WARN Notices)

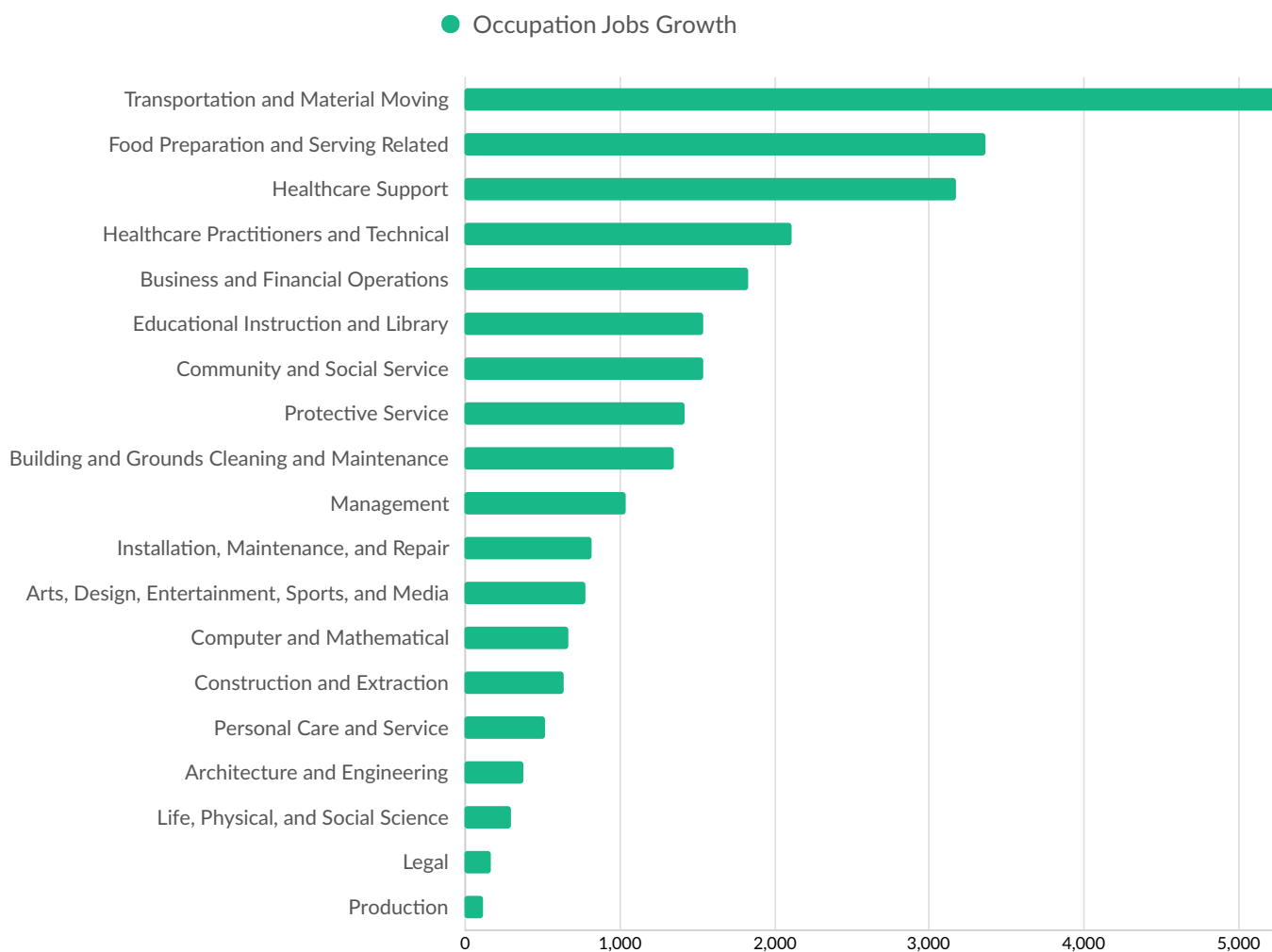

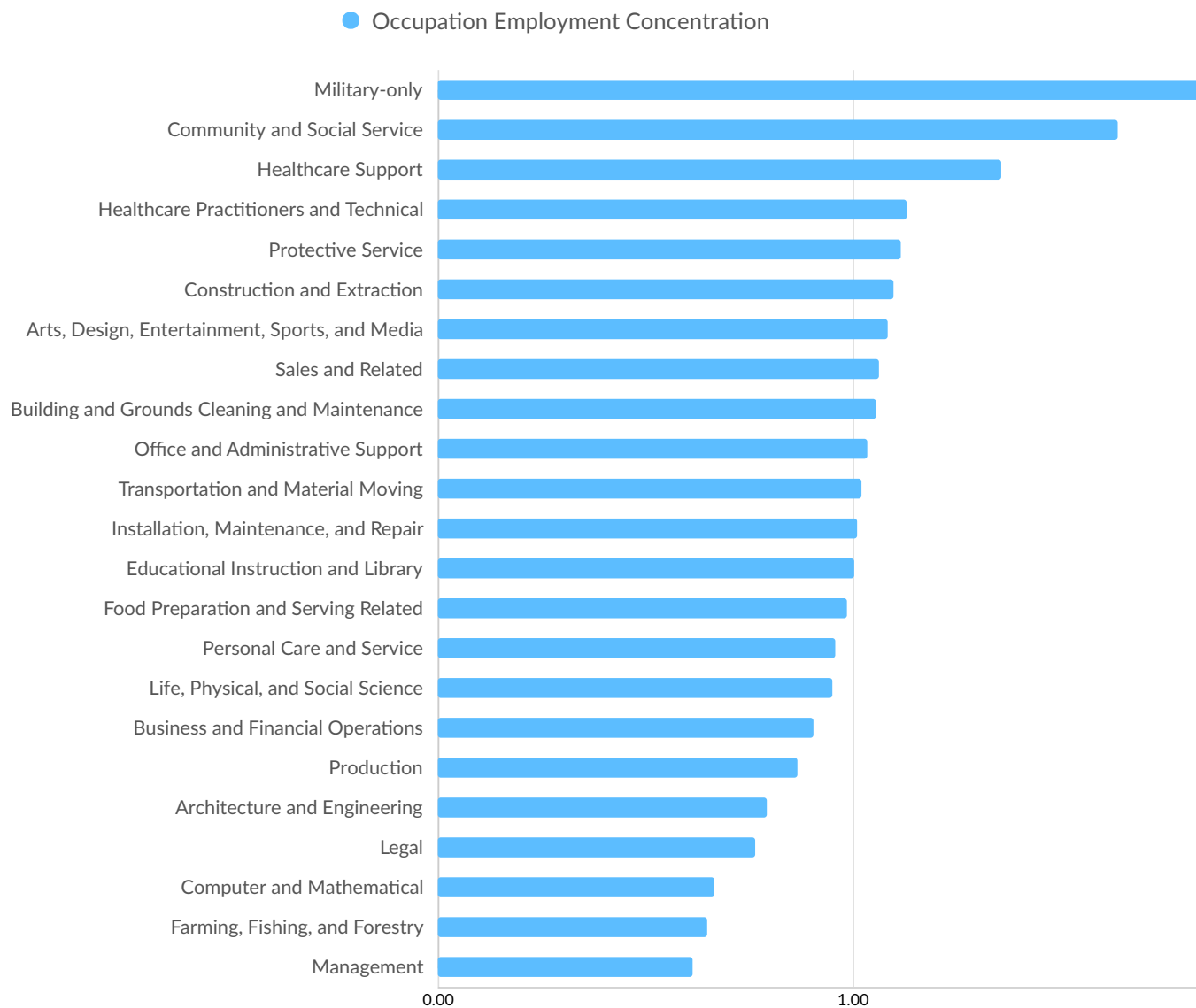
Largest Occupations



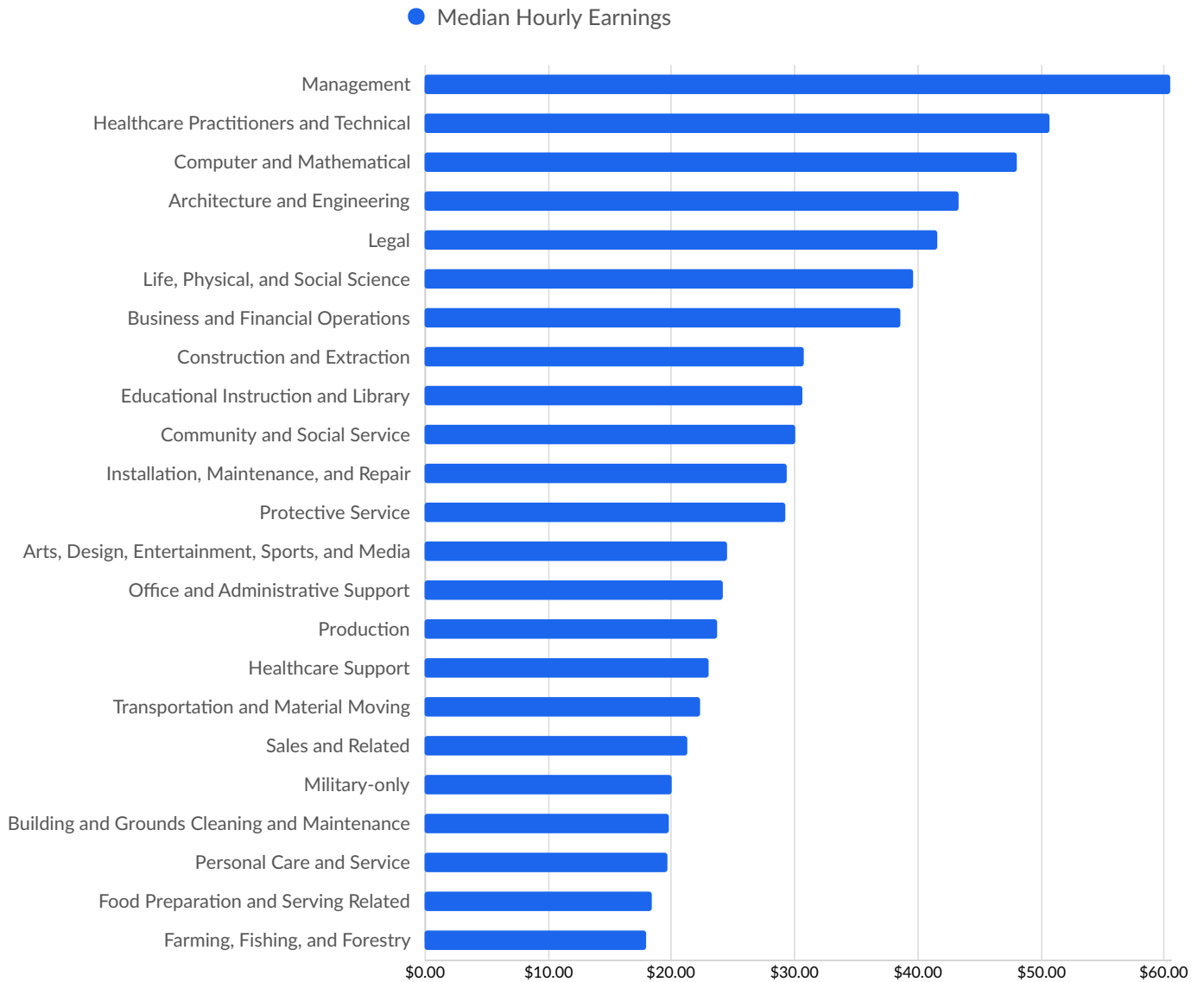
Top Growing Occupations



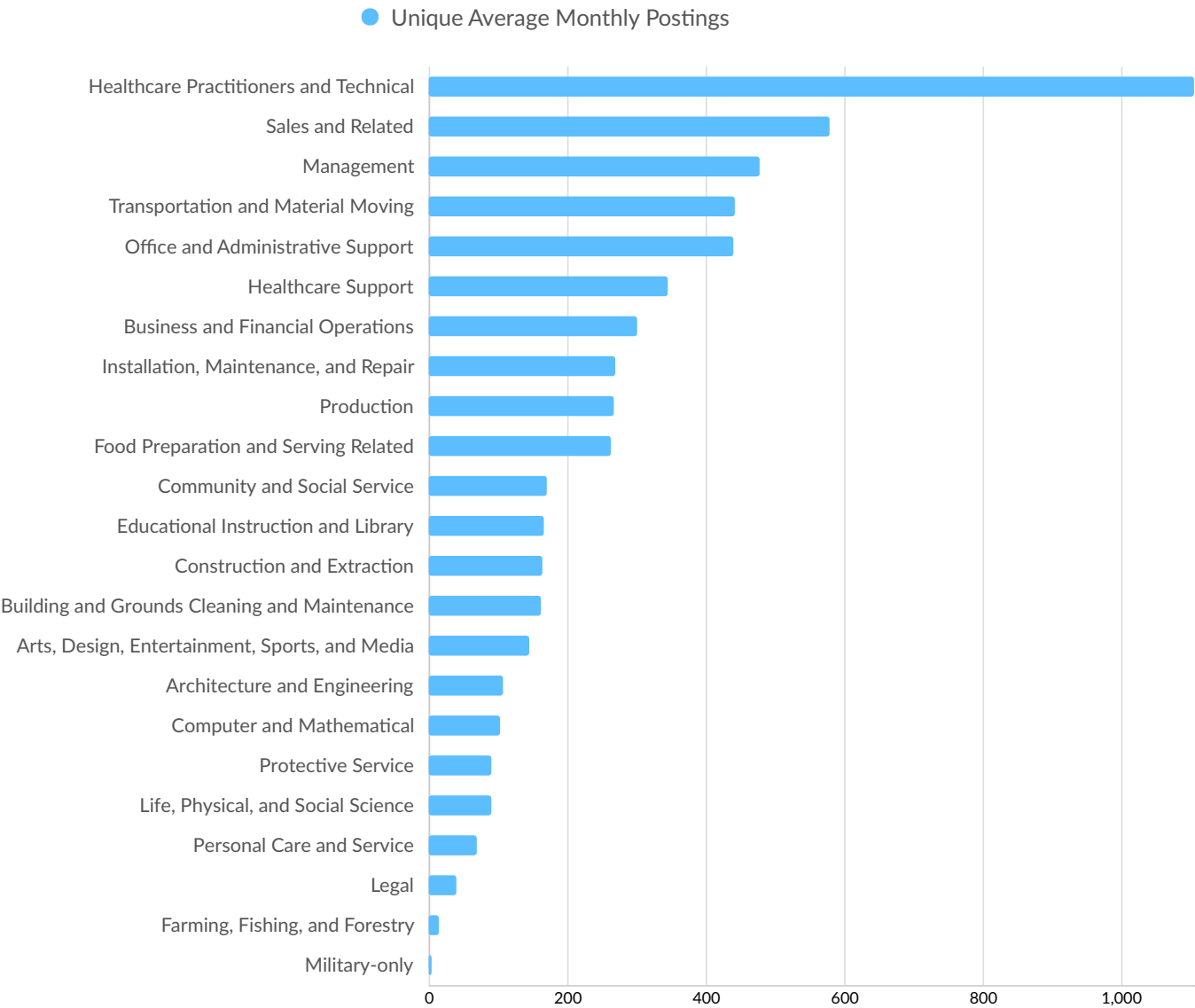
Top Occupation Employment Concentration



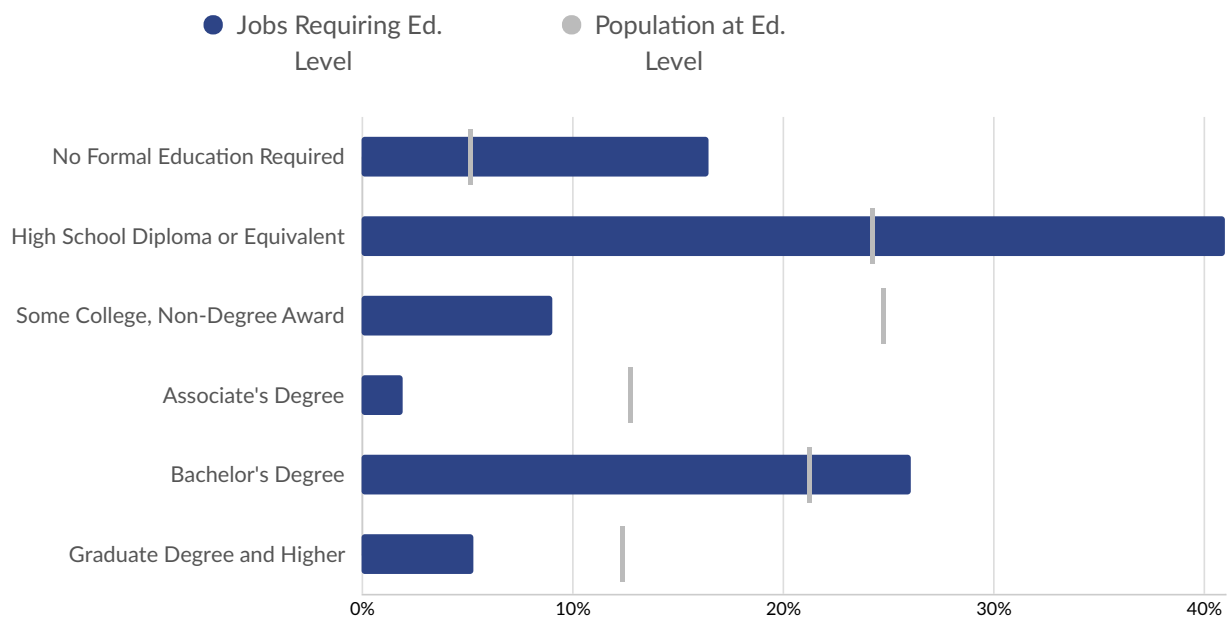
